Teaching Process



Motivating

Steps

- 1. Teacher describes relevant scenario
- 2. Students try to accomplish required productive activity

3. Teacher explains learning objectives and productive activities

Requirements

Scenario with high communicative value; cognitive challenging

Make students aware of their problems in finishing the task and arouse their desire to overcome the deficiency

Enable students to recognize both linguistic and communicative objectives, describes tasks

Enabling

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- 1. Teacher divides a large productive task into several mini-tasks
- 2. Teacher provides selective materials accordingly

Requirements

Students are able to describe the logical links between minitasks

Students are able to understand the links between segments of given materials and each mini-tasks

- 3. Students practice a task once they finish their selective learning
- 4. Teacher gives guidance and checks learning outcomes

Enable students to select relevant ideas, language pattern, or discourse structure

Students use what they have learnt to accomplish their task

Assessing

Steps

- 1. Self-assessment
- 2. Teacher gives criteria and guidance to evaluate
- 3. Students submit their products
- 1. Students give a peer review before next class
- 2. Teacher select typical products and evaluate collaboratively with students in next class

Requirements

Students are able to check how do they learn in class

Make criteria clearly and easy to check by students

Submit products with required format before deadline

Each student grades two products

Teacher needs to prepare detailed evaluation of all students.




argument directed against

Word Bank

- ad hominem adjective / æd'hpm.i.nəm/
 (of a criticism, etc.) directed against a person, rather than against what that person says:
 an ad hominem attack on his rival
- fallacy noun / 'fæl.ə.si/ an idea that a lot of people think is true but is in fact false: [+ that] It is a common fallacy that women are worse drivers than men.
- prejudice noun / pred3.a.dis/ an unfair and unreasonable opinion or feeling, especially when formed without enough thought or knowledge:

Laws against racial prejudice must be strictly enforced.

- inherently adverb /In'her.ant.li/
 in a way that exists as a natural or basic part of something:
 There's nothing inherently wrong with his ideas.
- refutation noun / ref.ju'teI.jan/
 the act of saying or proving that a person, statement, opinion, etc. is wrong or false:
 She published a refutation in the newspapers two days later.
