- Examples: Jiaozi (dumpling); Tangtuan (round sweet dumpling); noodles; Niangao (the New Year Cake)

- Point 2: The food eaten on this special day has symbolic meanings.
- Examples: *Jiaozi* –midnight; *Tangtuan*—sweet reunion; noodles—longevity; *Niangao*—improvement in life year after year

- Point 3: Recreational activities during the Spring Festival are various and colorful.
- Examples: performing dragon dance and lion dance; setting off firecrackers; visiting the temple fair; walking on stilts; watching the CCTV gala; playing majong
