H. H. Munro (Saki)

Saki, pseudo. of H. H. Munro (1870-1916), English author. He is best known for his witty, sometimes whimsical, often cynical and bizarre short stories; they are collected in Reginald(1904), The Chronicles of Clovis (1911), Beasts and Super-Beasts (1914), and other volumes. Munro was killed in France in World War I.



Writing style

Saki's short stories are famous for their surprise or unusual plot developments to entertain readers. The structure of "The Open Window" is actually that of a story--within-a- story. The larger "frame" narrative is that of Mr. Nuttel's arrival at Mrs. Sappleton's house for the purpose of introducing himself to her. Within this narrative frame is the second story, which is told by Vera, Mrs. Sappleton's niece.

Historical context of the

story

Saki does not specify when the story takes place, but it is obvious that the story is set in Edwardian England, the period of time early in the 20th century when King Edward VII ruled England. During this time, England was at the peak of its colonial power and its people enjoyed wealth and confidence because of the nation's status in the world.
