In a lot of ways my life is like the sport of rowing.

American expressions on colors

Every people has its own way of saying things, its own special expressions. Many everyday American expressions are based on colors.

Red is a hot color. Americans often use it to express heat. They may say they are red hot about something unfair. When they are red hot they are very angry about something. The small hot-tasting peppers found in many Mexican foods are called "red hots" for their color and their fiery taste.

Pink is a lighter kind of red. People sometimes say they are in the pink when they are in good health. The expression was first used in America at the beginning of the 20th century. It probably comes from the fact that many babies are born with a nice pink color that shows that they are in good health.

Blue is a cool color. The traditional blues music in the United States is the opposite of the red hot music. Blues is slow, sad, and soulful. Someone who is blue is very sad.

The color green is natural for trees and grass. But it is an unnatural color for humans. A person who has a sick-feeling stomach may say he feels a little green. A passenger on a boat who is feeling very sick from high waves may look very green. Sometimes a person may be upset because he does not have something as nice as a friend has, like a fast new car. That person may say he is green with envy. Dollars are called greenbacks because that is the color of the back side of the paper money.

The color black is used often in expressions. People describe a day in which everything goes wrong as a black day. The date of a major tragedy (悲剧) is remembered as a black day. A blacklist is illegal now. But at one time, some businesses refused to employ people who were on a blacklist for belonging to unpopular organizations.

In some cases, colors describe a situation. A brown out is an expression for a reduction in electric power. Brown outs happen when there is too much demand for electricity. The electric system is unable to offer all the power needed in an area.

Passage two

What sets Chinese painting apart from Western painting

Because of different instruments, materials, and cultural backgrounds, Chinese painting sets apart from Western painting. Unique Chinese painting owes much to the use of the Chinese writing brush and the Chinese paper. There are four essential elements used in the creation of Chinese painting, the brush, ink, paper, and the ink stone. Lacking any of them the job cannot be done.

The most important factors for Chinese painting are the special teaching methods, the close relationship with the painter's personality, and Chinese philosophy (哲学). They are trained not only to convey the objects, but also to express the mood and the spirit of the subject. The Chinese also believe that the painting is the expression of the painter's knowledge and temperament (性情). In this way, Chinese painting becomes something much more than art.

The most essential philosophy of China is the unity of the heavens, Earth, and human beings. What the Chinese painters are trying to express is not what meets the eye, but their attitude to the great nature. The Chinese painter has a profound love and admiration for nature. It is part of their culture, religious practices, and their need to depend on nature to survive. In the same theme they may spend hours thinking and drawing inspiration (灵感) from nature. From the minor or simple creatures that are chosen as subjects of art work, we can see how they enjoy nature and the love they devote to the most $\frac{1}{1}$ humble things.

The Chinese painter finds it offensive to contemplate and draw the human figure by itself. Human beings are part of the surrounding heavens and Earth. They are all together. That is why Chinese paintings are simple in composition and full of harmony, overall balance and peace.
