These examples make the concept of *guochao* accessible, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of Chinese culture among the international audience.

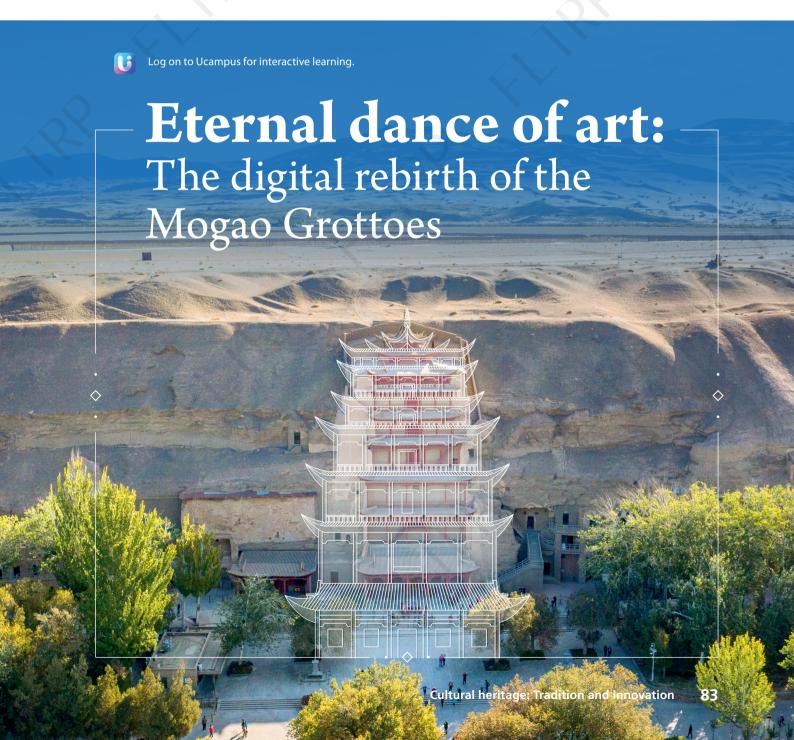

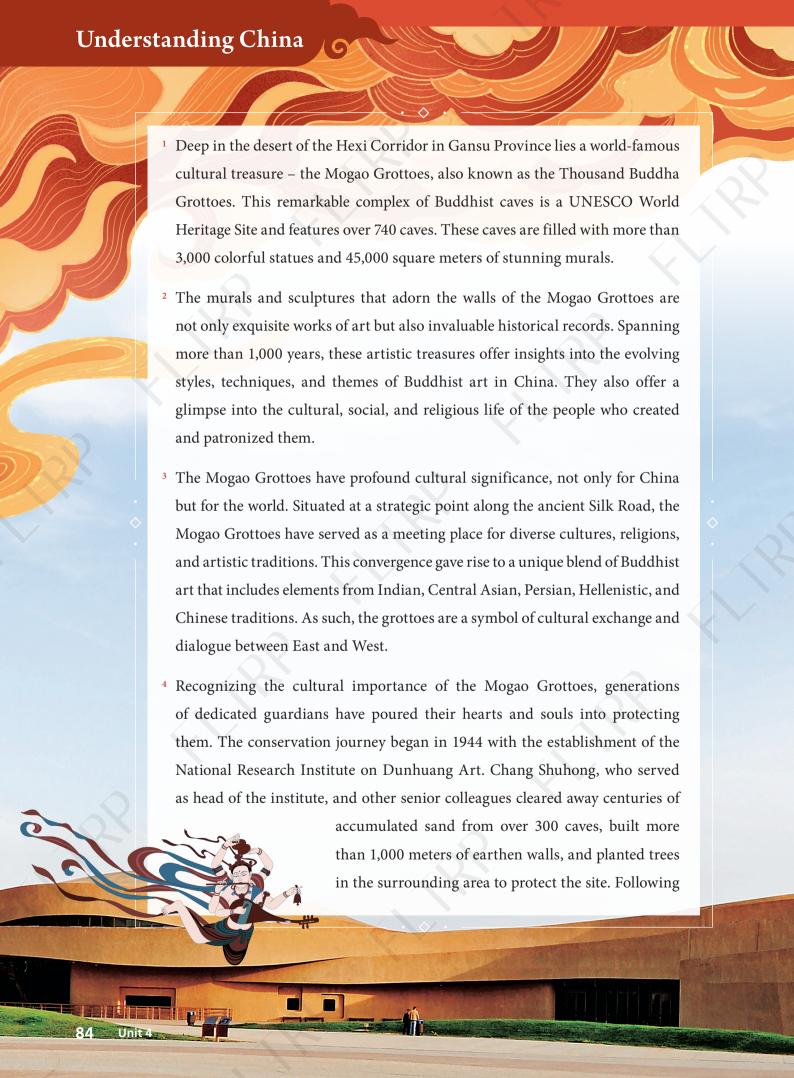

These dedicated and innovative efforts underscore China's commitment to safeguarding its rich cultural heritage, spanning from systematic conservation to cutting-edge digital projects.





the suggestion of Duan Wenjie, who started working as the archeological team leader in 1946, researchers adopted a new method of copying the murals that did not involve direct contact with the wall surfaces, thus preventing additional harm to the murals.

- Following in their footsteps, Fan Jinshi, an archeologist and former director of the Dunhuang Academy, has dedicated her life to the preservation and study of the Mogao Grottoes. In the 1980s, after seeing photos of the caves taken in 1908, she was shocked by the significant deterioration of the murals, colored sculptures, and other artifacts in just 70-80 years. She advocated for the use of computer technology as a means to preserve the endangered Mogao Grottoes, aiming for their permanent preservation and sustainable use. Thus began the Digital Dunhuang. This groundbreaking project aims to create complete digital records of the grottoes, including their full collection of cultural relics, by processing and permanently storing 2D and 3D data using photogrammetry and 3D digital reconstruction technologies, among other methods. The project has made great strides in creating digital data archives, image processing, 3D reconstruction of sculptures and caves, and panoramic tours, along with the scanning of archived images and the establishment of a digital team.
- ⁶ In 2014, a digital display center for the Mogao Grottoes was established. The center developed films about the site's history and the fantastic artistic works found inside the caves and presented these films to visitors. This has made it possible for the cultural heritage of Dunhuang to be exhibited at various venues outside of the grottoes.
- ⁷ By visiting the Digital Dunhuang website launched by the academy in 2016, people worldwide can explore high-definition images and take a panoramic tour of 30 famous caves. In September 2017, the English version of Digital



Dunhuang was launched, bringing the grottoes to an even broader audience in 78 countries, including the U.S., Japan, Canada, and Australia. The website has seen over 22 million visits so far.

- 8 The Digital Dunhuang website has evolved over time. In 2022, a blockchain-based Material Library and co-creation platform was launched, allowing access to over 6,500 of digital assets for download and co-creation. In 2023, the academy and a Chinese tech company launched the Digital Library Cave. This game-like program recreates all the minute details of the cave's ancient frescoes and cultural relics with millimeter-level accuracy, and provides the audience with an immersive experience. The partners also created a virtual ambassador of the Mogao Grottoes, named Jia Yao, to engage the public through interactive exhibits.
- ⁹ Emerging from the sands of time, the Mogao Grottoes now step gracefully into the digital age. The whispers of history echo through the virtual caves, which breathe new life into the ancient stone. The Mogao Grottoes are a promise to the future a promise of eternal beauty, boundless knowledge, and a shared cultural heritage that resonates through the ages.

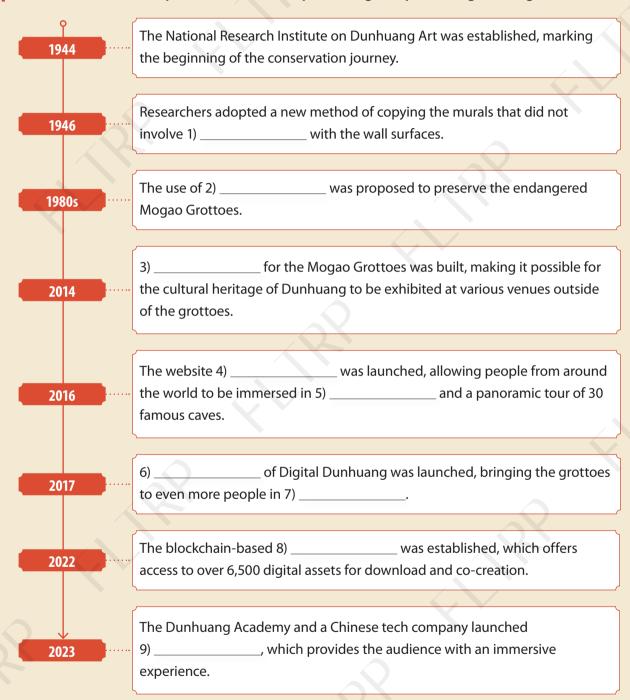

A UNESCO World Heritage Site is a place or area that is recognized by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) as having outstanding cultural, historical, scientific, or natural significance to humanity. These sites are considered to be of immense value to the collective heritage of humanity and are legally protected by international treaties once designated. They range from natural landscapes, such as national parks and biodiversity hotspots, to cultural landmarks like ancient cities, historic monuments, and archeological sites. Each site is selected based on rigorous criteria that consider its universal value and integrity.

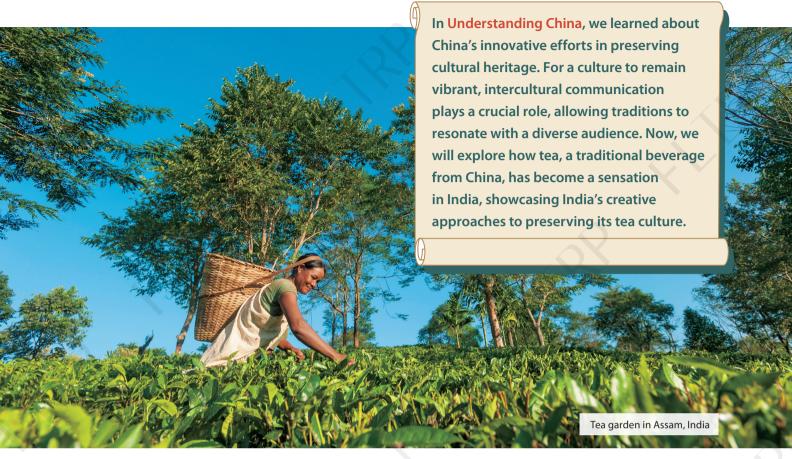
